

## Dress Code Policy Bear River Charter School

### Purpose:

The purpose of the dress code is to ensure that students are able to focus on learning without unnecessary distractions because of styles of dress. All students should come dressed in a way that prepares them for the classroom and experiential learning that is at the core of Bear River Charter School's Mission.

### Logos, Emblems, and Writing on Apparel


No profanity, offensive symbols, or derogatory wording is permitted. Vulgar words, profane or obscene slogans, pictures or advertisements of alcohol, tobacco, and/or drugs, or those that promote violence or sexual harassment on clothing are not acceptable.

### Irregular Clothing Items

Costumes, pajamas, and other clothing not typically worn in a school shall not be permitted, except by special exception for unique classroom or school events, which require administrative approval in advance.

### Clothing Coverage

Hoodies, hats, or other headgear that hide or obscure the identity/face of a student are not allowed. Religious exceptions are permitted. While standing, clothing must cover all areas of the body as identified in the illustration below. Note that the illustration is the same for front and back clothing.



PROCEDURES:

**Adjustments to Dress code**

The Bear River Charter School Board of Trustees reserves the right to adjust dress code policies and standards at any time. The Board of Trustees will utilize multiple means to communicate changes to all stakeholders.

The Bear River Charter school administration reserves the right to clarify or create additional restrictions or exceptions to dress code policy.

**Failure to Comply with Dress code**

Bear River Charter School will follow the discipline policy when dress code violations occur. Examples of consequences include but are not limited to: verbal warning, phone call home, parents bring a change of clothing, removal from the classroom, and temporary removal from the school.
