

GOOD READERS' HABITS

Look It Up! Try to guess what an unfamiliar word means from context, then look it up to see if you're right.

Sound It Out! Read out loud or whisper and mouth the words. Try reading in the characters' voices.

Picture It! Make pictures in your mind as you are reading.

Sum It Up! Talk about what you are reading to a family member, teacher, or friend.

Use Your Brain Power! Predict what you think might happen.

Write It Down! If you have trouble remembering, take brief notes on what you read. It often helps you retain information.

Connect It! Make connections to your life and the people around you.

Read Everything Around You! Notice how many words you see in a day and how they help people find where to go, tell them how to use a product, or entice them to buy something.

Goal! Set a reading goal. Place a bookmark where you want to stop. You might even want to keep going past it!


