

Keys to a Successful Transition

- Parent/Student talk to the school attending next year.
- Ask if you need to fill out a transfer form.
- Ask if you can fill out a registration of classes for next year.
- If you can fill out a registration form, ask Mrs. Jones & Ms. Wolf about the appropriate Math and English classes you should take.
- Some schools will make you wait until the beginning of next year to do what's called "New Student" registration. Often much of this can be done online to avoid long lines and unnecessary work.
- Do your homework when it comes to selecting a school. You may think it's normal to have 20+ students in a class, but many schools have 40+ in each class. Ask about class sizes if that's important to you.

-If you have any questions at all, talk to your school counselor, **Mr. Kener**, for any help you may need. He's got a lot of experience to answer most questions you may have.
