Regular classroom instruction will take place on a Monday through Friday schedule.

Students and employees at Endeavor Hall are not required to be vaccinated. However, we encourage ALL eligible individuals to get vaccinated.



We will remain mindful of safe spacing and cleanliness to the highest degree possible. We will continue to follow best practice for cleaning and sanitizing.



COVID-19 cases counts will still be monitored by the county health department. If cases reach a threshold for dismissal (30 cases) the health department may initiate a rapid testing program to reduce the amount of time that students are away from school. Participation is completely optional but students with a negative test result will be allowed to return to school sooner. Those who are vaccinated will not need to be tested.



Quarantine decisions for students and staff who may have been in close contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19 will be made with the county health department. Quarantined individuals may need to follow one of more of the following protocols:

- Quarantine for 10 days from date of contact before returning to school.
- Quarantining for 7 days and being able to return on day 7 with a negative test result, or
- Remaining at school, but wearing a mask for 10 days.



*Please be aware that, per state law, Endeavor Hall does not have the authority to initiate a mask mandate for students. This is a dynamic situation, and Endeavor Hall will comply with any and all state directives made at any point during the school year, and we will continue to adhere to guidance from the health department.

Here at Endeavor Hall we care about everyone's health and safety, and we will continually strive to keep parents updated as the year goes on.


Our Food Pantry has a lot of great items available for you. The list includes the following and more:
