Goal #1: Students will improve SAT scores in two ways. Our average ACT composite score will improve from 24.6 in 2023 to above 25 in 2025. Also, our percentage of students scoring about 18 will go from 92.6 in 2023 to above 95% in 2025.

How measurement was completed:

UCAS continues to have success with their ACT prep class and the 4 February Saturdays boot camp to help juniors and ambitious sophomores prepare for their ACT testing in March. Data from our current seniors who took the ACT last March was gathered starting their sophomore year while attending Mr. Isom's Leadership/ACT class. This particular class took practice tests during their sophomore year on paper but then for their actual ACT test, were asked to take their ACT test on the computer. We did not see a significant decline in scores but were concerned this may impact it. Our ACT score average continues to increase. Our average ACT score was 26. Whereas 93% of our students' scores were above 18. We hope to continue to work on the later part of this goal.

Goal #2 Our students will earn fewer C, D, and F grades. 2 years ago we determined that about ten percent of the grades we issued were in the C, D, and F range. Since we are an early college high school and students need to maintain a 3.0 to participate this is too many. We aim to reduce this percentage each year. Our students will earn 95% A and B grades; thus only 5% C, D, and G grades.

How measurement was completed:

During the 2024-25 school year 498 students finished a full year at UCAS. Our data shows 14 9th, 14 10th, 9 11th, and 11 12th graders fell below the 3.0 expectation.

UCAS was unable to meet the increase from 90-92% in this goal. The 2024-25 school year showed 90.4% met the 3.0 CE requirement. UCAS will continue to work with study hall teachers to provide strategies when working with students during study hall.
