A. Athletics Enrichment. Update provided by Allie Tafoya, shared by PSO President Jenilyn: Spring sports update. MS girls volleyball: the 7th grade team's season ended, they finished strong, 8th grade plays in their playoff tournament as the #3 seed this evening at 5:15 in Jefferson. MS boys soccer finished 1st in league and won their playoff game on Monday. They play tomorrow (Wednesday) 4:50 at Lincoln in round 2. HS golf finished first in league, won the league tournament, sent a team to sectionals where they missed sending an individual to masters by 2 strokes. Won section academic champions. Coach Fisher was named coach of the year. HS tennis battled the rain all season, but finished strong, placed 4th in league and won section academic champions. Our JAA HS track and field team had an incredible showing at the CVCL league

championships on Wednesday, May 7 including a first place gold medal in the 4 x 400m relay! Teammates Mariyah Patterson, Katie Pacheco, Mikele Jopson and Ava Eryomenko gave their best effort to win the event and qualify for sections. Ava Eryomenko also won the mile and came in 3rd for the 2 mile, while Mikele Jopson took the silver in the 2 mile and bronze in the mile. On the boys side, David Bubliko, Nate Wilson, and Johnny Morgan capped off their season with strong performances as well! Congratulations team! HS boys volleyball tied for first in league with Encina. Made it to the semi final playoff game, lost on the road to Bear River and won section academic champions. Your HS girls soccer Lady Patriots are the Division 7 section Champions. These ladies played with pure grit and love for the game. This was the greatest game I've ever witnessed! Thanks to everyone that has supported us this season! "Coach Molly" Jessika Rubick was named Scholar Athlete of the year and awarded a \$1,000 scholarship from the CIF from the A Dale Lackey fund, this fund is made possible by foundation games played throughout the section. B. Arts Enrichment. Update provided by Greg Blankenbeler & Nickole McEndree, shared by PSO Secretary Andi Bonner: Virtus won a top Gold rating at the 2025 Anaheim National Heritage Festival in March, plus 3 highest awards: 1st Place in the Chamber Choir division, Best Overall Choir and Adjudicator's Choice Trophy. Virtus and Schola both earned unanimous superior ratings at the Golden Empire Music Festival at Sac State in March. All the choirs will be performing in the upcoming Spring Arts Festival: Elementary and 7th grade choirs this Friday the 16th, High School and Schola Choirs on Saturday the 17th. Virtus will be performing "West Side Story" on both nights. Band, Strings and Piano performed in a concert on Wednesday, May 7th. The scholars continue to show tremendous growth. Theatre performed "And Then There Were None" on April 25th and 26th. Our Arts programs at Roseville are growing in excellence and scholar involvement, thanks to good teachers, parent involvement and supportive
