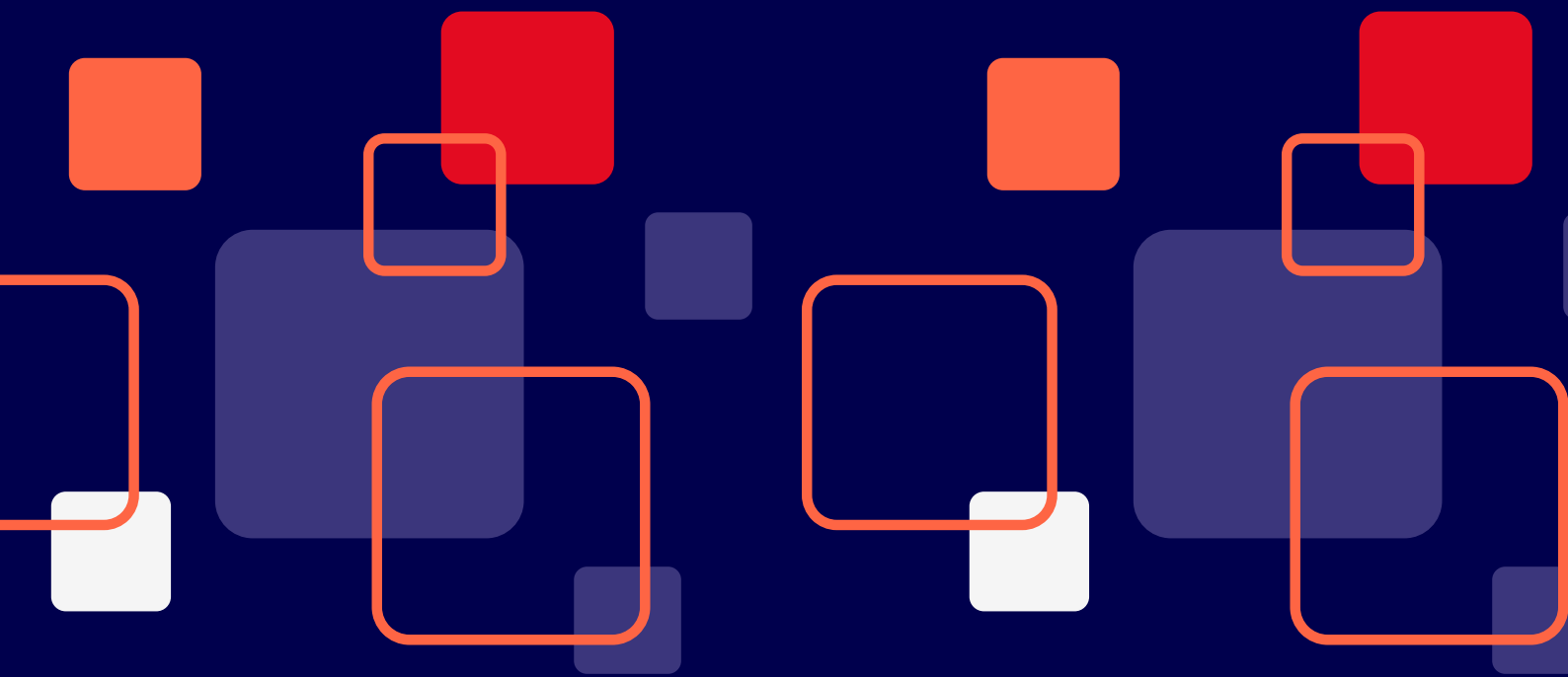

The Ranches Academy asks that each family volunteer 40 hours of time each school year.

Volunteers must always check in at the front desk and receive a badge. If you are a first time volunteer, please bring your drivers license. After your license is scanned, you will be in our system which tracks your hours and performs a soft background check.

We understand that it is not always possible for people to volunteer their time. We also accept donated items/funds which count toward your volunteer hours. You can do this by providing items to your child's classroom or special activities and events. Even babysitting while another parent volunteers can count! If you volunteer from home or make donations, you can log your hours through our website.

STUDENT Curriculum

Students receive differentiated instruction in reading, writing and arithmetic. This allows the student to work with peers at a pace and curriculum level best suited for their needs. It also allows the teacher to focus on individual needs better as differentiated groups tend to be smaller in size than the regular classroom size.

Core Knowledge

The Core Knowledge Sequence provides students with a broad knowledge base, rich in vocabulary, on which future instruction can build, broaden and deep. The core is structured to continue throughout a student's education, becoming more detailed and sophisticated in each grade. Using this approach has proved to increase information retention. When meaningful content is paired with effective teaching skills, skill development has shown to come more easily.

• NO CELL PHONE ZONE

Phones and phone watches are not allowed in our classrooms. They must be kept on silent and in backpacks during school hours. If a child breaks this rule, the teacher may take the device and require a parent to come pick it up. If you need to communicate with your child, please call the front office at 801-789-4000.

SCHOOL Attendance

We love your children and want to them to attend school everyday! While sick children should be kept at home, please send them if they have not had any symptoms for 24 hours without medication..

Research shows that missing 10% of school (about 2 days a month) negatively impacts a student's academic performance. While academics are important, students also develop positive relationships with teachers and peers. Consistent attendance allows them to feel comfortable at school, participate in classroom discussions, collaborate with other students, develop and practice social skills and become connected to our school community.

Being on time is essential too! When students are tardy, they miss out on important morning routines and activities. It is also disruptive when students arrive late. Please be on time!

STUDENT Support

- **SOCIAL SKILLS GROUP**

Social development is paramount to a student's success. We offer whole class instruction on social skills, mindfulness, communication, emotional regulation, etc. These lessons and activities are age appropriate and experiential while providing students opportunities to develop practical skills that support their well being. When more support is needed, it may be recommended that a child attend small groups which reinforce these skills. Parent permission is always required for students to participate in small groups.

**We contract with Sonatix Wellness to provide these services. Jill Osborn is our Behavior Specialist who provides these lessons and small groups.

- **INTERVENTIONISTS**

Our Interventionists work with students one-on-one and in small groups for extra support in needed subject areas and for progress monitoring.

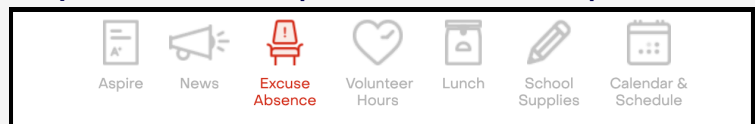
- **BEHAVIORAL SUPPORT**

FAQ

• EXCUSING AN ABSENCE

Use the link in the top right corner of our website to excuse an absence. If the student will be gone for an extended period of time, please request an Independent Study Contract through your child's teacher. A minimum of 5? days notice is required for an Independent Study Contract.



• CHECKING IN/OUT

Students are required to check in at the front office if they arrive at any time other than our regular start time.

Students can only be checked out by authorized individuals designated in your Aspire account. Please plan on presenting an ID to check out students. We want to keep our students safe!

• BACKGROUND CHECKS

If you would like to attend field trips, please stop by the office for instructions on how to get a background check completed.

• SCHOOL LUNCH

We do not participate in the free or reduced price lunch program. Students can bring a home lunch. We have several microwaves for warming food with a 90 second limit. Food sharing is not permitted to avoid issues with allergies.

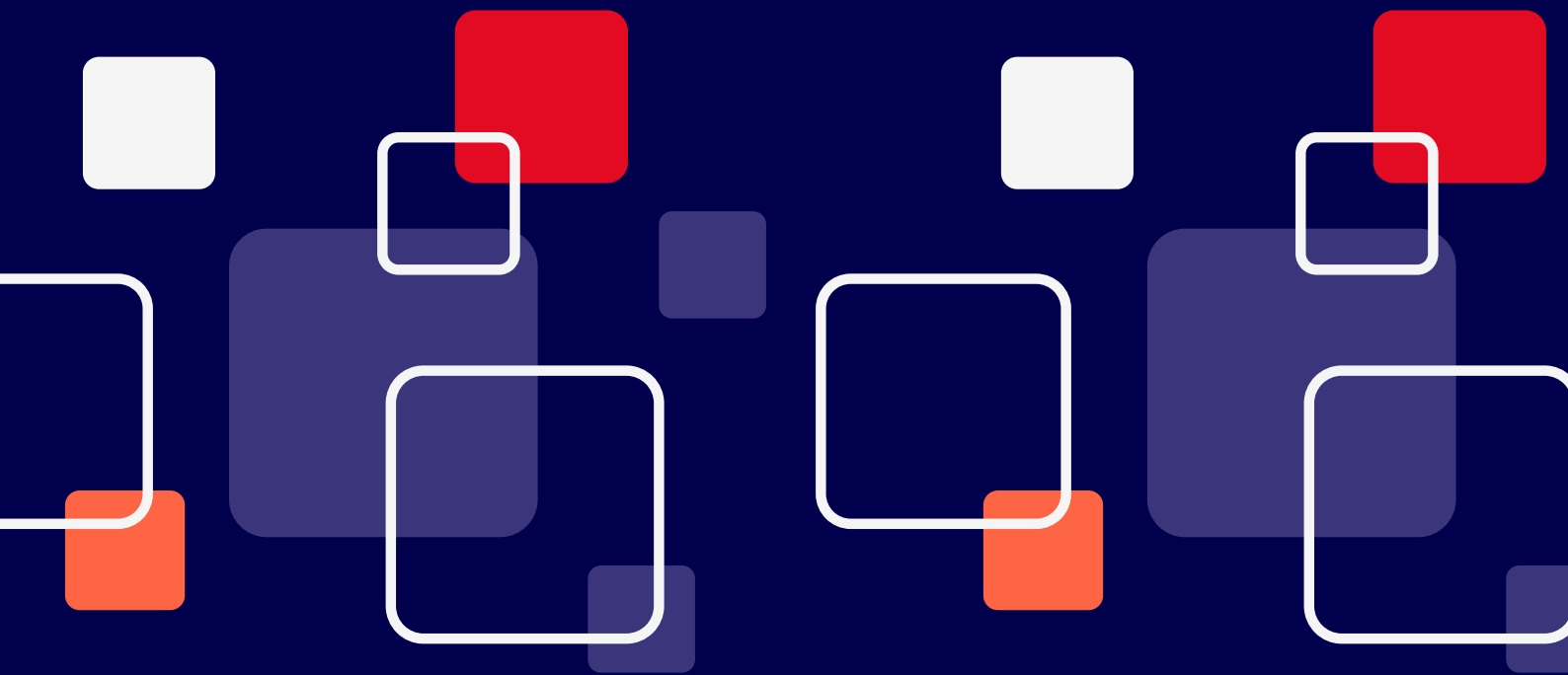
